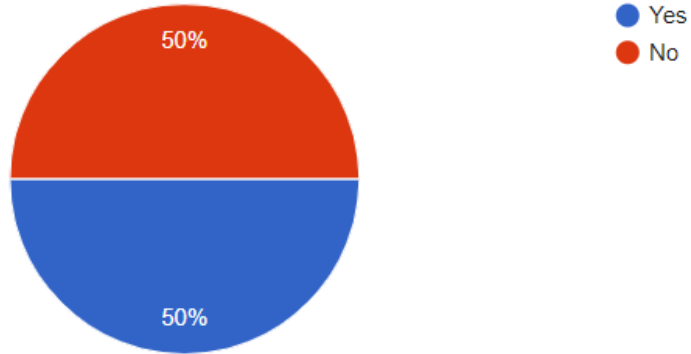

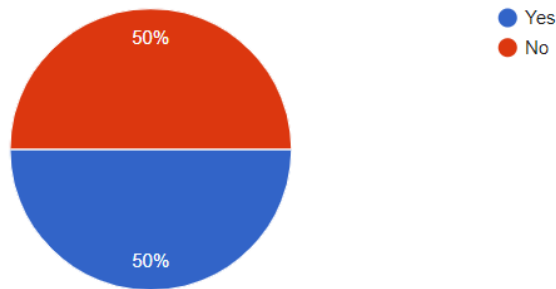
Are you aware there is support on our website on how to talk about sex and relationships at home with your child?

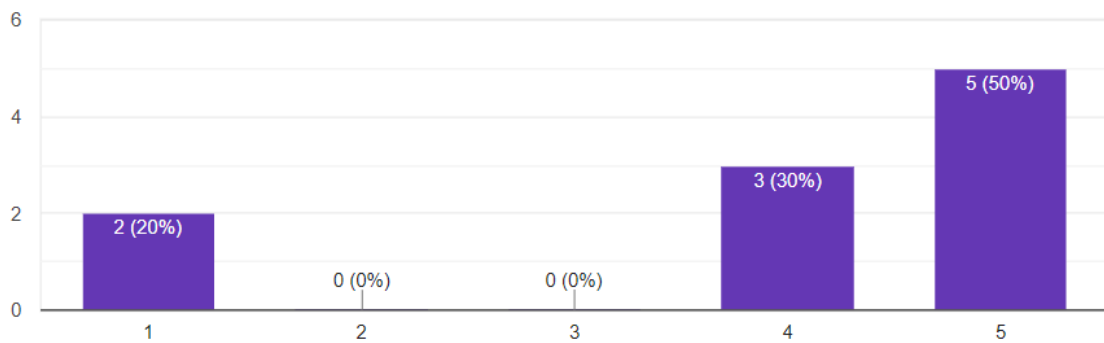
